

- How does John's "throne room" experience compare with other similar encounters recorded in Scripture? (Exodus 24:9-11, 1 Kings 22:19, 2 Chronicles 18:18, Isaiah 6:1-3, Ezekiel 1:26-28;10:1)
- If someone asked you why you worship God, what reasons would you give? What reasons does John give in Revelation 4:11, 4:9-10, 11:16-19 for worshipping God? How important is worship in your life?
- Why is the lamb the dominant image in the Book of Revelation?
- When John switched the metaphor from the Lion of the tribe of Judah to the Lamb standing as if it had been slain, how did that transform the expectations of the first century audience? Read Genesis 49:8-12, (Isaiah 11:1-16, Hosea 5:14)
- In the book of Revelation the number 7 is a symbol of completeness and fullness. What do the seven horns and seven eyes represent in 5:6?
- What made the slain lamb worthy of worship in the same way as the father?
- In what ways does the crucifixion and resurrection relate to the sacrificed lamb?
- Why is a leader that is willing to die for His enemies worthy of being followed?
- The lamb is the one who initiates all seven judgements and leads His people to springs of living water and wipes away their tears. (Revelation 6:1-8:5) Does the image of the lamb point to the main theme of Revelation encouragement and salvation or Judgement and wrath? Why?
- Why is the book you want your name written in called the lambs book of life? Why are believers called the bride of the lamb?
